

R**AWARDS****1 Provincial Colours**

Provincial Colours shall be awarded under the following circumstances;

- 1.1 Senior colours to skaters who hold the required test qualification and compete for their province in the Senior or Junior section at the Senior National Championship in the Singles, Pairs, Ice Dancing or Synchronised Skating disciplines.
- 1.2 Senior colours at the discretion of the Provincial Committee, to an Administrator, Judge or Official, IN HONORIS CAUSA, where outstanding service to the cause of Figure Skating has been rendered to the Province.
- 1.3 Junior colours to skaters who hold the required test qualification and compete for their Province in the [Novice, Pre-Novice or Juvenile](#) section at the Junior National Championship in the Singles, Pairs, Ice Dancing or Synchronised Skating disciplines.
- 1.4 Where applicable the test qualification must have been obtained six (6) weeks prior to the date of commencement of the National Championships.
- 1.5 All colours badges must have the word(s) "SINGLES", "PAIRS", "ICE DANCING", "SYNCHRONISED SKATING" or "IN HONORIS CAUSA" as a base line to the badge.

2 National Colours

National Colours shall be awarded under the following circumstances.

- 2.1 Senior colours to skaters who represent South Africa in an ISU Senior Competition [listed in the official ISU Communication issued yearly by the ISU. Competitions listed on the ISU Webpage but not in the annual ISU Communication are not recognised for these Senior Colours.](#) The Senior colours must be represented on the SAFSA recognised green blazer, SAFSA badge and scroll with the word(s) "SINGLES", "PAIRS", "ICE DANCING" or "SYNCHRONISED SKATING".

- 2.2 Junior colours to skaters who represent South Africa in an ISU Junior Competition listed in the official ISU Communication issued yearly by the ISU. Competitions listed on the ISU Webpage but not in the annual ISU Communication are not recognised for these Junior Colours. The Junior colours must be represented on the SAFSA recognised green blazer, SAFSA badge, a scroll with the word(s) "SINGLES", "PAIRS", "ICE DANCING" or "SYNCHRONISED SKATING" and a further scroll with the word "JUNIOR".
- 2.3 Novice colours to skaters who represent South Africa in an ISU Novice Competition listed in the official ISU Communication issued yearly by the ISU. Competitions listed on the ISU Webpage but not in the annual ISU Communication are not recognised for these Novice Colours. The Novice colours must be represented on the SAFSA recognised green blazer, SAFSA badge, scroll with the word(s) "SINGLES", "PAIRS", "ICE DANCING" or "SYNCHRONISED SKATING" and a further scroll with the word "NOVICE".
- 2.4 At the discretion of the Council, Senior colours to anyone recommended by the Executive, or a Provincial Committee, IN HONORIS CAUSA, on account of special services rendered to figure skating on behalf of the Association at a National level. The Senior IN HONORIS CAUSA colours must be represented on the SAFSA recognised green blazer, SAFSA badge and a scroll with the words "IN HONORIS CAUSA".
- 2.5 Senior colours to anyone serving on the Council for three (3) consecutive years for meritorious service. The colours must be represented as described in rule R.2.5 of these regulations.

3 Protea Colours

The award of Protea Colours may be recommended by the Executive of SAFSA in conjunction with the International Selections Committee to the South African Sports Commission for participating in an ISU Competition/Championship as follows:

3.1 Senior Protea Colours

To a participant representing South Africa in a Senior Grand Prix-, Four Continents- or Senior Worlds Championship.

3.2 Junior Protea Colours

To a participant representing South Africa in a Junior Worlds Championship.

4 The Max Staub Star

The Max Staub Star shall be the highest award of SAFSA for outstanding service to South African Figure Skating.

- 4.1 The recipient need not necessarily be a South African citizen. Each case is accepted on merit for outstanding service to South African Figure Skating.
- 4.2 The recipient may only be an eligible person.
- 4.3 Should be considered annually but not necessarily awarded.
- 4.4 No more than two (2) awards are to be made annually.
- 4.5 Nominations are to be [submitted to](#) the Council [by](#) the first Council meeting of the each year.
- 4.6 The award(s), when possible, is/are to be presented at the National Championships.
