**RESULT CALCULATION AND PUBLICATION
6.0-BASED JUDGING SYSTEM**

1 System in use

The 6.0-based judging system must be used to mark:

- 1.1 the Ice Dancing Senior, Junior, Novice and Pre-Novice sections of the National, Interprovincial and Provincial Championships,
- 1.2 the Ice Dancing Star Tests.

2 Recording of marks awarded

- 2.1 Two separate marking cards shall be provided for each competitor.
- 2.2 The final results are calculated only from the marking cards. Transfer of marks onto summary sheets is, except in the case of international competitions and championships, permitted.
- 2.3 There shall be two Accountants each of whom shall, together with a reader, act independently of the other and shall be required to perform his/her duties in respect of one set of the marking cards.
- 2.4 The reader shall take no account of the Announcer but shall read out the marks as displayed by the Judges to the Accountant concerned.
- 2.5 On each marking card the marks awarded to the competitor, pair, couple or team concerned shall be entered by the Accountant and checked by him/her. The factors of value, if applicable, shall then be applied and the calculation involved shall be carried out to two decimal places; the third decimal place shall be ignored.

3 Calculation Method (One-by-One Comparison (OBO))

- 3.1 In all Ice Dancing events:
 - (a) Each compulsory dance will be a separate part of the event. The two marks being awarded for each compulsory dance, Technique and Timing / Expression, are added together. The sum is the total points for each compulsory dance for each Judge. The total marks for compulsory dances will not be added together.

- (b) The marks for Composition/Required Elements and Presentation of the original dance are added. The sum is the total points for the original dance for each Judge.
- (c) The marks for Technical Merit/Required Elements and Presentation for the free dance are added. The sum is the total points for the free dance for each Judge.

4 Calculations to determine place numbers (Ice Dancing)

- 4.1 After the end of each part of the competition, the place numbers of each couple must be determined on the basis of all couples participating in such part.
- 4.2 For each couple a direct comparison with all other couples on a one to one basis will be made. This comparison is done Judge by Judge comparing the total points awarded. The higher total points counts as a Judge in Favour and two (2) Points in Favour.
- 4.3 Ties
 - (a) If two couples receive from one Judge an equal number of points in a Compulsory Dance, the couple with the highest mark for Technique receives a Judge in Favour and two (2) Points in Favour. If the Technique marks are also equal, both couples receive one (1) Point in Favour.
 - (b) If two couples receive from one judge an equal number of points in the Original and Free Dance, the couple with the highest mark for Presentation receives a Judge in Favour and two (2) Points in Favour. If the marks for Presentation are also equal, both couples receive one (1) Point in Favour.
- 4.4 The number of Points in Favour are added up over all the Judges for both the couple and the compared couple separately.
- 4.5 The couple with the highest number of Points in Favour in this comparison receives a Win and two (2) "comparative points". If this number is equal for the two (2) couples, they both receive one (1) "comparative point".
- 4.6 The number of "comparative points" and Points in Favour are totalled for each couple over all comparisons concerned.

5 Determination of results of each part of a competition (Dance)

- 5.1 The couple who has the highest number of “comparative points” is placed first. The next highest is placed second, etc.
- 5.2 If two or more couples have obtained the same number of “comparative points”, the first placed is the competitor / team who has the greater number of Points in Favour.
- 5.3 If the foregoing rules fail to determine the award of any place, then the couples tied for that place must be announced as tied. If two couples so tie for first place, the next place to be awarded is third place (not second). If two couples tie for second place, the next place to be awarded is fourth place (not third) and so on.

6 Determination of the final result (Dance)

- 6.1 After having determined the result in each part of the competition, the placing obtained by each couple in each part of the competition must be multiplied by the appropriate factor:

One compulsory dance	0.4	(20%)
or		
Two compulsory dances	0.2 each	(10% each)
Original Dance	0.6	(30%)
Free Dance	1.0	(50%)

- 6.2 (a) The results so obtained are added and the best placement of each couple shall be decided on the basis of the lowest total obtained in the three parts of the competition combined.
- (b) The placing for compulsory dances multiplied by its factor is added to the placing for the Original Dance, multiplied by its factor. The sum of these is the total for the Compulsory Dances and the Original Dance combined and the best (cumulative) placement shall be given to the couple with the lowest total. If two or more couples receive the same total, the placement shall be decided on the best placement for the Original Dance. If such placements are also equal the couples concerned are tied.
- (c) If two or more couples receive an equal total for all parts of the competition combined (final result), the best

placement shall be decided on the basis of the best placing for free dance. If the placings for the free dance are also equal, the couples concerned are tied.

- 6.3 In the case of ties in the final result, duplicate medals for the place for which the competitors are tied must be awarded.

7 Publication of results (Dance)

- 7.1 The placings in each part of each competition must be calculated and published immediately after that part has been completed by all couples. The referee will announce the results of each compulsory dance. The classification list with the placement for each couple by each judge shall be given to all judges concerned immediately after the completion of each part of the competition. (If two compulsory dances are skated, after the completion of the second dance).

- 7.2 The final result must be published and announced as soon as possible after the conclusion of the competition. This must include for each couple:

- (a) the final result;
- (b) separately, the placing in each part;
- (c) the placing after the Compulsory Dances;
- (d) the placing in Compulsory Dances and Original Dance combined.

The placings under (b), (c) and (d) must be mentioned after each couple's name.

- 7.3 The publication of interim and cumulative results is allowed if in accordance with the above section, Determination of the Final Results.
- 7.4 The results calculation forms must be open to inspection for some time after the competition.
- 7.5 One of the two sets of the original results calculation forms of every competition must be handed over immediately after the event to the Referee concerned, to enable him to make his report in due time.
- 7.6 When an electronic computer is used for the calculation of the results, it shall be the responsibility of the Referees, immediately after the completion of the event in question, to verify and then to certify the results in writing with respect to the first five places.
